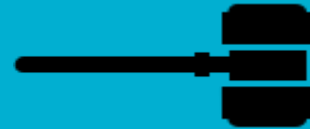

The **Key** to Award Writing is to look at the FFGC objectives and see how your Programs and Events achieve those goals.

NOTE: When typing up your Award, Judges should not have to get out a Magnifying Glass to read your award. If you want them to read your award, use a readable font size, 9pt is too small and it depends on the font also, so stick with Arial.

Award Application: This award was designed to stimulate new ideas for meeting the needs of the community and to create a closer relationship between the community and garden clubs. EXAMPLE:



“The Garden Club provided an educational program for the club and public with the step-by-step process of container gardening to enhance the appearance of the local Downtown area. We met...

Think Like a Judge



Example cont...We met onsite Downtown at an intersection. 4 Horticulture leaders took small groups to create 3 large container garden on each corner of the intersection. What kind of soil, plants and how many plants were discussed with the group. Then  demonstration on how to remove a plant from a garden pot, prepare that plant and how deeply to plant it. cont....

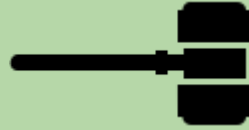


Example cont...Completed one container together and had the participants plant the 2 remaining containers.

We then discussed...How to fertilize and when.

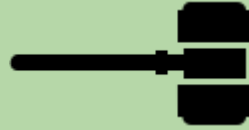

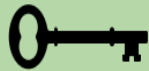
Many Applications neglect how many members and how many from the public participated. Points are subtracted for this every time.

5. Project expenses and means of funding

#5 is often not covered in award applications.

Points deducted- Let's Explore what is needed



Think Like a Judge



Award Application: **5. Project expenses and means of funding**

Your Project may be funded from your Club's Budget, by donations of members or by a business. You need to explain what the expenses were and how they were paid for.

Flowers \$150. Donated by a member

The project expenses total \$567 and was planned for and paid for by the Club. Or

Members donated all materials used in the amount of \$98.00

You can secure you pictures, articles, landscape drawings manually. hint* then place them on a copier and make a copy. This way none of your items become unattached.

You can do all the work ahead of time and then secure a computer savvy person to insert all of your information.

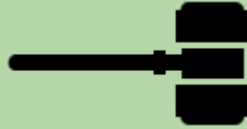

Label them with names of plants, names (if appropriate). Labels help judges understand what you are sharing.

Unless another Scale of Points is indicated under a specific award, the Basic Scale of Points will be used to judge all FFGC Awards

Applications: Be sure to study the requirements for each award and understand which Scale of Points will be used for judging that award

Publicity is Important. It is like having a Party but not sending out the invitations. No one shows up.



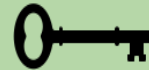

Get the Word Out Months, Weeks and the week before the event is happening. Have you sent it to FFGC to have the Event on the FFGC Website? Create an Event on Social Media? Ask the local paper to announce it? Taken flyers to Public Places? Do not forget about **“WORD of MOUTH,”** People to People.

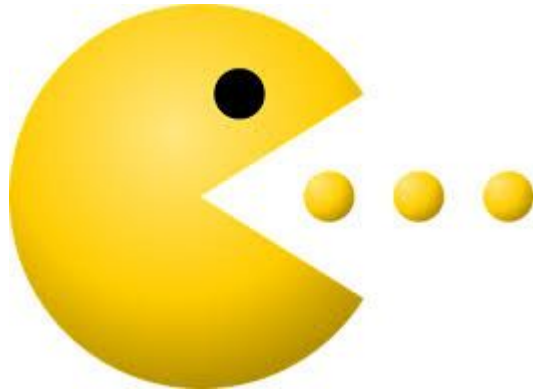

So Early? Yes!

Make a Copy of the Entire Award.

Start filling out your Award Application

Contact those involved in Program.

Treasurer, Chair, Photographer.

Tell them what you need and when.

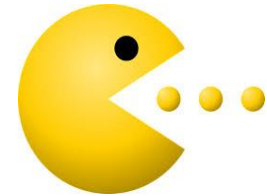

Take copious notes if you work this way.

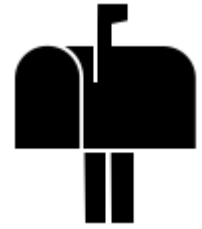
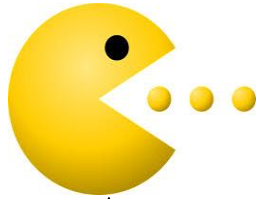
And review everything about Award Writing before you begin. Our memories are faulty, so repetition & review are going to serve you very well.

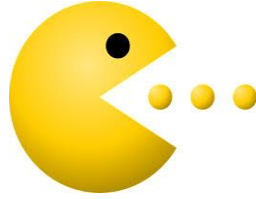
Mailing off your Award.

Do send 2 copies.

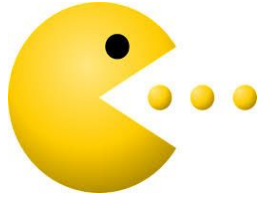


Small Bites

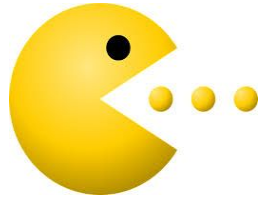

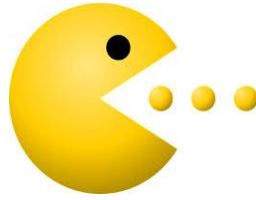

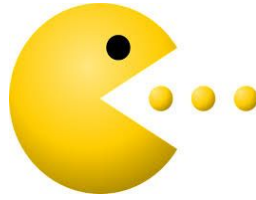
